Cllr Mary Green reported:

- The works at the NKDC courtyard at the Sleaford offices are now complete and it is now open for safe access to the Civic Suite for public meetings.
- StreetSafe is a national service for anyone to anonymously tell Police about public places where they have felt unsafe and the reason for it, e.g. Street lighting, abandoned buildings, vandalism, being followed or verbally abused. It is part of the government's agenda to tackle violence against women and girls, although it is open to anyone to use. To flag up an area where you do not feel safe just go to:- www.lincs.police.uk/notices/street:safe/street-safe
- Physical meeting arrangements at the NKDC Offices - Since the return to physical meetings, there have been various safe measures in place. Thank you for your support and understanding while these have been in place. The Corporate Risk Assessment which supports this has undertaken a further review and consideration of the latest information has concluded that it is appropriate to lift the safe measures, with effect from 6 June 2022. Whilst distancing and the requirement to wear a face covering will be removed, the practice of good hygiene continues to be encouraged. We will continue to use hand sanitiser and good ventilation of our buildings as effective tools to help each other stay safe. Some may wish to continue to wear a face covering and we thank you for your consideration of the needs of others.
- The Agile by Design working system has now been put in place, which means many officers and NKDC colleagues across the organisation are working between the office and home, it is

hoped this will continue to maintain a high standard of delivery of services to our residents whilst reducing the carbon footprint of the council.

- Annual Council Meeting took place on Thursday 12 May, where the appointment of the Chairman of Council, Cllr Mrs Lucille Hagues was made.
