### What is a Neighbourhood Panel?

Your Neighbourhood Panel consists of local people, and representatives of the community, who live or work in the area. The panel's purpose is to identify issues that are affecting the community taking into account the views of the community.

### What does the panel do?

They meet quarterly and assess all the information collected at the meeting, and consider all the issues raised. The panel then agree on neighbourhood policing priorities to be focused on during the next three month period. The Neighbourhood Policing Team then adopt a problem solving approach and are encouraged and empowered to work locally with NKDC and government agencies to address the priorities set.

### Your current priorities set by the Panel for this area are:

1. Seasonal crime prevention activity to reduce dwelling burglaries linked to the end of British Summertime.
2. Seasonal activity to encouraging children to be safe and seen walking or cycling.

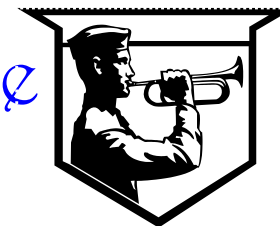

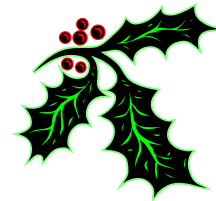
#### Play Park Group Quiz

#### Police Scam alert

There has been a recent series of incidents whereby fraudsters either phone or attend the home address of elderly members of the public, claiming to be police officers. The fake officer/s will claim that they are investigating a fraud which they believe the elderly person to be a victim of. The fake officer/s will then request the bank cards and personal identification numbers (PIN) of the victim and claim these are needed for investigation purposes. Before letting anyone into your home who claims to be from any law enforcement agency, ask to see their identity card and check it by calling 101.

**The Police will never ask for your PIN or passwords. Do not give this information to anyone. The Police will never request that you withdraw/transfer any money to them.**
