Roads and Potholesa message from Marianne Overton.....

"Today, I questioned the Highways Councillor from Grantham about whether it was really acceptable to leave dangerous 4cm potholes in our rural roads for three months. He talked about lack of funding and prioritising other roads. Cllr Hill said we do not leave dangerous potholes in the highway. So when is a 4cm deep pothole in the highway not dangerous?

As you know, I have been part of the national team instrumental in getting extra £13.7m for Lincolnshire roads, plus £14m over two years for additional costs with being rural. I am I incensed to see the contract now changed so that some of our rural roads will be expected to wait not 28 days, but 90days, three months! This is unless they are "link roads", but it is not clear what is meant by a "link road". You may have seen that the recent maintenance programme left our rural areas seriously at the back of the queue. Traffic has risen by 42% on our rural roads in the past fifteen years, but there is not the corresponding increase in maintenance and our rural roads are still being left behind.

The Council has won awards for highways, but it was not mending roads!


I have made a start raising the issue. We now need a campaign. Please can you help? Attached is a petition which I hope you will feel able to help with.

Does it matter??

the Local Government Boundary Commission for England (LGBCE) will be conducting an electoral review of North Kesteven District Council.

Essentially this is an examination of the following matters:

- the total number of councillors elected to the local authority;
- the number and boundaries of wards for the purposes of the election of councillors;
- the number of councillors for any ward of a local authority; and the name of any ward

It has been 15 years since the Commission has undertaken a review of North Kesteven with those electoral arrangements taking effect at the District & Parish elections held in 2007 and so it is timely for them to conduct this review but also because there are some electoral imbalances which meets their criteria:

- a. If one ward has an electorate of +/-30% from the average electorate for the authority
- If 30% of all wards have an electorate of +/-10% from the average electorate for the authority.

The object of the review is to ensure a consistent level of representation across the area of North Kesteven.

This means ensuring that, as far as possible, each councillor represents the same number of electors.

The timing of the review will ensure that revised electoral arrangements will be introduced in time for the next ordinary District & Parish Council elections in May 2023.

Can we turn an idea into reality.....?????


What to do with the Playing Field has been a question that has occupied many minds in Beckingham for quite a considerable number of years!!!
